Victor Lee Austin, Theologian-in-Residence of the Diocese of Dallas, grew up in Oklahoma, went to college in New Mexico, and has served churches in New York. His work has been at the intersection of theology and everyday life, with questions of authority (which he thinks is necessary) and ethics (which he admits is perplexing) and simple on-the-street thinking about being a priest in our world. His latest book is a theological memoir of his wife, titled *Losing Susan: Brain Disease, the Priest's Wife, and the God Who Gives and Takes Away*. And coming soon is *Friendship: The Heart of Being Human*. Canon Austin has two grown children and six grandchildren.



## The Very Rev. Timothy Kimbrough

Timothy Kimbrough is Dean of Christ Church Cathedral in Nashville, TN. He is a graduate of Duke University

and Duke University Divinity School. He has also done graduate work at General Theological Seminary in New York City. Dean Kimbrough has also served as adjunct faculty at the Duke University Divinity School teaching worship in the Anglican tradition and polity. He has just completed a term on the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church with a special focus on domestic and international missions. He has published an English translation of a German volume on Charles Wesley's theology. Additionally, several of his musical compositions have been published in various hymnals and songbooks.



## The Rev. Daniel Strandlund

Daniel P. Strandlund grew up in the Diocese of Alabama and served as an Associate Rector at St. John's Episcopal Church from 2015 until 2017 when he and his wife Lucy moved to Austin, TX. Lucy is pursuing ordination and will finish her M.Div at Seminary of the Southwest in Austin, TX this spring.
