The Four Realms of Human Need

I have often heard people dismiss their problems as inconsequential or unimportant by saying, "I have a roof over my head and food on the table, I have nothing to complain about." I have also heard people relativize others' problems by telling them, "You have a roof over your head and food on your table, what do you have to complain about!" While it is true that many in the world do not have their basic physical needs met, there are other human needs that must be met for us to live a physically, emotionally, intellectually, and spiritual healthy life. In fact, deficits in the emotional, intellectual, and spiritual realm can contribute to anxiety and depression just as significantly as the absence of basic physical needs.

Look over the list below. Are there things on this list that are missing in your life? If you are parents, are there things on this list that are missing in your children's lives? How is St. John's doing as a church community to help people have their physical, emotional, intellectual, and spiritual needs addressed? If you find there are some glaring deficiencies in your life or your children's lives, what steps can you take to try to address them? How can friends, family, or the church help you? How can you be a good friend, parent, spouse, or sister/brother-in-Christ to help support others in their needs? Christ lived a fully human life. He calls us to live one, too.

February 5 How do we worship?


February 12 What about evil?

What is the Pastoral Care Committee?

- The Pastoral Care Committee (PCC) delivers meals to parishioners' homes following the birth of a baby, when someone is sick, recovering from a medical procedure or when there has been a death in the family.
- We assist at funerals providing light refreshments at visitations and receptions and have someone on hand to be representatives of the church.
- We mail note cards to elderly or infirm parishioners on a regular basis.

The committee consists of 12 teams, one for each month with a team captain and 3-5 members per team.

All information for particular needs goes through the Rector, however, the PCC committee welcomes information and requests from parishioners. We make sure the Rector is apprised of all requests.

Members of monthly teams are listed in the newsletters and service bulletins each week. We always appreciate new members joining the committee and while most members are women, we gladly accept men as participants

- Toilet tissue & paper towels (individually wrapped)




Mercy House Lunch Servers


